PPE Scholarship Application

The Council was awarded a SAFER grant in July 2011 to assist Florida volunteer/combination fire departments in recruiting new volunteers and assisting them in obtain their Firefighter I training. In December 2012 the Council amended their SAFER grant to provide FREE PPE (pants, coat, hood, gloves, and boots) to the new recruit. As a special condition to the award of PPE which is funded by a FEMA SAFER Grant, the participants must agree to and understand the following stipulations:

- · Turnout gear is only for newly recruited (after 07/10/2011) volunteer members;
- Newly recruited members must complete the Medical Examination Form DFS-K4-1022 (as described in Florida Administrative Code 69A-37.037) prior to requesting grant funds for the gear. Documentation of completed physicals will be required prior to funds being disbursed; and
- The newly recruited member(s) must complete the Firefighter Part I training as per FAC 69A-37 by the end of the Period of Performance. Firefighter Part I Certificate of Completion from Florida Division of State Fire Marshal (Florida State Fire College) will be required prior to award.

The following guidelines must be adhered to by all participants:

- 1. Provide proof of membership to a Florida volunteer or combination fire department starting after 07/10/2011.
- 2. Newly recruited volunteers must be at least 18 years old by the time of enrollment into the Firefighter Part I program.
- 3. For each scholarship awarded, the volunteer must commit to 24 months of active membership as defined by their fire department and remain in good standing with a Florida volunteer or combination fire department. If the individual leaves the fire department before 24 months, then the individual maybe billed for the cost of the PPE.
- 4. Volunteers who obtain a career firefighter job during the time of commitment must still fulfill their volunteer role in a department for a minimum of 12 months.
- 5. In order to be eligible, volunteers must attend and successfully complete one of the following:
 - Firefighter I Practical Skills Task Book (Second Signature) and live fire evolutions during the annual event (Scholarships available)
 - · S130/S190 during the annual event (Scholarships available)
 - · Attend a Council sponsored Firefighter I class
 - · Attend a Firefighter I class where the Council has assisted with FFI Task Book Second Signature Sign-off
 - Applicant's Fire Chief must complete the Financial Needs Statement.
- 7. Applications must meet all of the guidelines to be considered for an award.
- 8. The PPE awarded under these guidelines can only be used by the recruit/applicant listed.
